


## **Family Support**

## Christianity

- Devolved delivery of services to the Christian Church. This continued in Western society until the 18<sup>th</sup> Century
- Giving to charity was considered a mark of one's piety
- Level of social control inherent in structured system

  - Impotent poor
  - Idle poor
- Centrelink does this for us today



## Practice of Working with Families

### Practice of Working with Families

- □ Had it's beginning in the 1800's in England, Europe and USA
- Charity Organisation Society in UK
- Settlement Houses in USA
- Over time, it looked at addressing causes of poverty
- Recognised the need for emotional as well as practical and financial support

## **Charity Aid Society UK**

## Charity Aid Society UK

- Established to increase cooperation amongst charities
- Outcome to keep families together and out of the poorhouse
- Local committees found financial help wasn't enough to get families through a crisis
- Developed other agencies e.g. Labour exchange
- Still exist as Family Action in UK



## Social Casework & Advocacy

### Social casework and advocacy

This early work identified:

- need for training of volunteers
- address family environment
- hygiene/health/housing
- address the causes of poverty
- employment/education
- urging policy shifts on government

## **Service Development**

### Service Development

- These same movements and organisation were also developing in the USA through the Settlement House Program
- European countries were also designing similar approaches
- Australia was, of course doing the same through it's large established religious and charitable organisations

## Child Protection Movement

#### Child Protection Movement

- Alister Lamont and Leah Bromfield A History of Child Protection, AIFS October 2010
- First wave 1870's
- New York case where child, Mary McCormack was supported by SPCA as a "human animal"
- Carer was jailed and the first NSPCC was formed

## Child Protection Societies

#### Child Protection Societies

- NCPCC was formed in USA, Dec. 1874
- Liverpool SPCC was formed in 1883 by businessman Thomas
   Agnew, followed by London SPCC in 1884
- In 1889, the first Child Protection laws 'Children's Charter' was passed
- Australia followed these trends

## Family Support in Australia

### Family Support in Australia

- MHA5
- Dramatic changes to society
- Commission of Inquiry into Poverty 1975
- Consistent series of inquiries and reviews supported and recommended
  - Identified needs of families adequate income, housing, education, recreation, legal protection and healthcare

## **Royal Commission**

- Royal Commission on Human Relationships in 1977 by Chief
   Justice Elizabeth Evatt
- Arnott and Deveson identified that families and individuals needed to have:
  - An element of Social and emotional wellbeing
  - Ability to form stable and caring relationships with others
  - Connections to the Larger Community

## **Early Research**

## Early Research

- All Our Children: The American Family Under Pressure (Keniston 1977)
  - All families in today's complex society need help in raising children, caring for family members and coping with stressful events at some point in time: family self-sufficiency is a false myth

## **Early Research**

#### Early Research that informed development of FSSP

- The Ecology of Human Development (Bronfenbrenner 1979)
  - Influence of the family and institutions and environment that surround the family
- To empower people: The role of mediating structures in public policy (Berger and Neuhaus 1977)
  - Influence of mediating structures such as Church or neighbourhood on a families ability to provide nurturance to it's members
- Family Systems Theory (Minuchin 1974)
  - Build on families existing structure communication patterns to facilitate change



## Commonwealth Family Support

### Commonwealth Family Support Programme 1978

- Established in Commonwealth Office of Child Care as Family
   Support Services Scheme
- Provision of funds for community based services for families with young children who were experiencing stress or crisis and helping to develop a natural network of support, referral and self help services
- □ It was seen as provision of funds for personal welfare service aspects of family support as different to other supports i.e. income health education etc.

## Family Support Programme 1978

- Would support and compliment existing welfare structures
- Provide a stimulus to innovative thinking especially as alternatives to institutional and substitute care for children
- To develop a range of services to support families in their responsibilities in the rearing and development of children

## Early Family Support Services

- Home care Service of NSW established as Emergency Housekeeping
   Services during World War II, as well as Wanslea Family Services in Perth
- Dorothy Scott writes that in 1974, the Children's Protection Society Victoria established first Parent aide programs or what came to be known as FSS's

## **Family Support Work**

## Family Support Work

- Generally work outside formal settings
- Clients are often marginalised or demoralised by poverty and violence
- Starting where the family is
- Developing respectful relationships
- Setting goals
- Offering practical help
- Development of positive trusting relationships with families essential

## **Family Work**

## Family Work

- In 'Promoting Family Change' Bronwyn Elliott with Louise Mulroney and Di O'Neill describes Family Work in depth
- Can be described practice that addresses issues affecting the functioning of the family and the relationship between family members
- Recognises that all families exist within and are affected by their context
- Family work attends to the internal as well as external i.e. access to resources information etc.

## **Family Support**

### Family Support

- Style of practice is informal
- Work can be done in homes or in the car travelling to appointments
- Pace of work is unpredictable
- Responding to crisis as well as planned sessions
